**NEWS FROM THE DIOCESE OF RALEIGH**

**YOUNG ADULTS AGES 18 – 18 INVITED TO THE WORLD YOUTH DAY IN PANAMA:** The Office of the Secretariat for Lay Formation, Marriage and Family Life of the Diocese of Raleigh invites young adults to join in the common celebration of World Youth Day (WYD) 2019 in Panama.

We would like, as one diocesan family, to live and celebrate the universal Church!

Our pilgrim group will be in Panama from January 21-28, 2019, and our invitation extends to adults ages 18-35. The trip includes round-trip airfare from Raleigh to Panama, lodging at a 4-star hotel within walking distance of the WYD main events, covers the cost of WYD fees, lunches and dinners, and a bonus day trip to the Panama Canal to discover the Miraflores Locks, the Biodiversity Museum and explore the ruins of Panama Viejo.

The total cost per pilgrim is \$2,750, which can be paid through a payment plan.

**LAUDATO SI': ON THE CARE OF OUR COMMON HOME (Pope Francis)**

158. In the present condition of global society, where injustices abound and growing numbers of people are deprived of basic human rights and considered expendable, the principle of the common good immediately becomes, logically and inevitably, a summons to solidarity and a preferential option for the poorest of our brothers and sisters. This option entails recognizing the implications of the universal destination of the world's goods, but, as I mentioned in the Apostolic Exhortation *Evangelii Gaudium*, [123] it demands before all else an appreciation of the immense dignity of the poor in the light of our deepest convictions as believers. We need only look around us to see that, today, this option is in fact an ethical imperative essential for effectively attaining the common good.
